

**WORKSHOP MEETING
OCTOBER 5, 2010**

A workshop meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bradley Beach was held in the Meeting Room, 701 Main Street on the above date.

CALL TO ORDER

Council President Galassetti opened the meeting with a salute to the flag.

Sunshine Law

The meeting has been noticed publicly according to the Open Public Meetings Act requirement for "Annual Notice", and posted on the official bulletin board.

Roll Call 6:30PM

Present: Council: Cotler, D' Angelo, Engelstad, Galassetti
Mayor Schreck arrived at 6:53pm

The purpose of this meeting was to discuss matters of public interest.

Council discussed several bid options for the trash and recycling specifications:

- Businesses paying for the services
- Reducing the number of days for pick-up
- Change of the time of collection along Main Street
- Informing businesses of the company which collects oil for free
- Increase of code inspection
- Collection of non-food trash only
- Schedule collection of recyclable materials on Saturday only
- Pickup services only in the back of businesses

Council also discussed the following items:

- Stop the use of chemical lawn treatments on all municipal property and use of organic materials
- Educate the public about associated dangers with use of chemical treatments on lawns and encourage the use of organic products town wide
- Designation of smoke free areas on the beach
- Enforcement of the present code regarding signage
- Number of vacancies and redevelopment on Main Street – possible re-zoning for more residential only on Main Street
- Public relations with public and businesses
- Physical condition of Main Street streetlights, trees and pavers
- Concern of the Fire Department's financial situation and possible meeting with representatives for discussion of the department's future

- Response to fire calls by the fire department
- Low number of active members
- Encouragement of municipal employees to join the local emergency service units
- Regionalization for purchases of emergency equipment such as aerials
- Possible appointment of a Public Safety Director to oversee operations of the fire and first aid departments
- Department Officers term of service
- Risk to Borough concerning Right to Know etc
- Addressing sewer and storm drain problems in next year's budget
- Entering into an interlocal with Asbury Park of videotaping of the towns sewer lines
- Reducing energy costs in future budgets by the installation of LED lights

Council also agreed that they would like to conduct a public meeting to discuss the current problems related to trash and recycling with the commercial business owners. They also stated their commitment to work with the business community in order to attract new businesses and public to the area.

Harvey Rosenberg suggested that the Borough separate the business district in the bid specifications for trash and recycling services.

William Psuik suggested that commercial lawn services obtain a permit from the Borough providing the municipality as a way of knowing what type of fertilizers and pesticides are intended for use on private properties.

Police Lt. Fahnholz stated that during a recent drill over the past weekend all emergency departments and services worked together. The critique at the drill addressed manpower, set-up etc. He noted that Unexcelled Fire Department offered to respond during daytime calls as opposed to calling Ocean Grove or Avon Departments.
