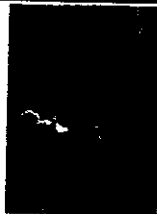

To Mayor Schreck and the council members:

I am writing this letter to request the use of the boardwalk in Bradley Beach for a 5K race. I am a member of Grace Christian Church in Tinton Falls, NJ. Grace Christian Church and Team World Vision will be partnering in this race to raise money for Haiti. All proceeds will go directly to Haiti relief.

We plan to have the 5k race on Saturday, June 12, 2010. The race will begin and end on the Asbury Park boardwalk and registration will also be held in Asbury Park. It will be an out and back course, so the race will run through Asbury Park and Ocean Grove and the turn around point will be on the Bradley Beach Boardwalk. We estimate that we will need about 1/4 of a mile of the Bradley Beach boardwalk. We will need use of the boardwalk from 8:00 to about 9:00 am. We plan to use volunteers to marshal the course, take registrations, pass out water and clean up after the race and do not anticipate the need for any public assistance from Bradley Beach other than the use of the boardwalk. We already have approval from the Asbury Park and Ocean Grove communities, and we will be using 2 EMT's from Asbury Park to cover the first aid needs.

WHEREAS, Bradley Beach is determined to be an example to other communities across New Jersey in recruiting and educating its residents about citizen leadership and non-elected public service opportunities;

March 23, 2010

A regular meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bradley Beach was held in the council chamber on the above date.

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Julie Schreck opened the meeting with a salute to the flag.

Sunshine Law

The meeting has been noticed publicly according to the Open Public Meetings Act requirement for "Annual Notice", and posted on the official bulletin board.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

Council discussed the recent damage to the solar panels at the municipal building. Engineer Koch advised that the panels need to be removed as soon as possible for health and safety reasons. During the recent storm winds bent the racks which support the panels causing a collapse of the solar panel system. Also the sewer plant sustained damage during the storm.

Council reviewed a proposal for extending the Geese Peace Service Agreement for the year 2010 requesting that Bradley Beach contribute \$4,200.00 this year towards the \$21,000.00 budget for this program. Mayor Schreck said that while she believes the goose population has

gone down the problem is not completely under control. Councilman Engelstad agreed that the program hasn't been effective. Councilman Cotler suggested that the Council seek input from both the Fletcher Lake and Sylvan Lake Commission before making a final decision on participation for this year.

Council reviewed correspondence from the Sylvan Lake Commission concerning the condition of the boat ramp and Flume. The Administrator will have a meeting with the Borough of Avon and the Engineer in order to reply to the inquiries.

Council reviewed a request from Jerome Beckman a commercial tenant requesting an adjustment of parking regulations on LaReine Avenue by 706 LaReine Avenue and agreed to wait for a comprehensive parking study of the entire town is completed by the Police Department. Council hopes that action maybe taken by mid April.

Council noting that Pre Season Badge Sales were conducted during the month of December over the past few years a sale requiring a purchase of 30 or more badges for hotels, motels and Bed and Breakfast at a cost of \$60.00 per badge would offer a break for those establishments which will offer them to guests throughout the season. The owner of the Sandcastle Inn on Third Avenue is interested in purchasing adult badges in bulk. Councilman Galassetti disagreed with the idea noting that such places should have purchased badges during the actual pre-season sale.

Council discussed and established initial beach locker rental fee noting that there is a limited number of lockers available as some renters have not renewed for this year. Council decided to establish the initial fee of \$325.00. Council also discussed locker placement and accommodating renters requesting certain locations. While Council agreed that some people with handicaps and other needs that require a locker close to the beach, Council concurred that the Borough will continue its policy of doing the best we can to accommodate people but cannot guarantee a placement of any locker.

Council reviewed an energy proposals from GEXA and Liberty Power. Mayor Schreck advised that an interlocal committee maybe formed to investigate energy purchasing. Councilman Engelstad requested that the staff inquire if any municipal clients participate with these firms. Councilmen Galassetti and Cotler requested that Jersey Central Power and Light also be contacted.
